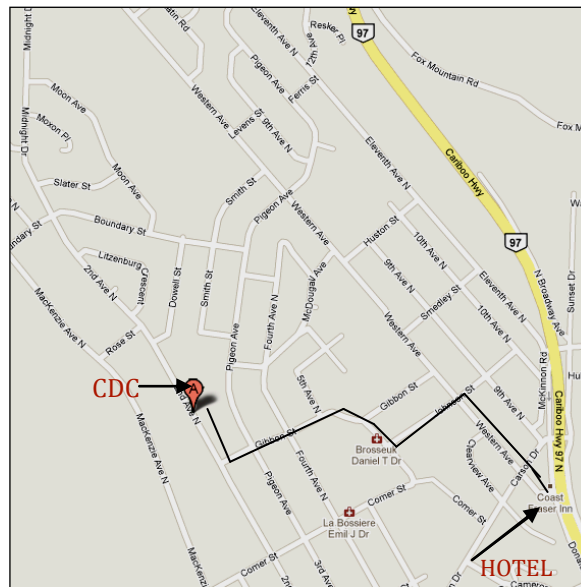

### COURSE DESCRIPTION

This intensive 5-day workshop is designed to acquaint OTs, PTs and SLPs working with children with movement disorders with an introduction to the Neurodevelopmental Treatment Approach. NDT certification is not required. Participants will experience typical and atypical development, broadening their understanding of the movement challenges faced by their clients. Practicums and treatment demonstrations will augment didactic instruction.

### Learning Objectives

- Participants will achieve a basic understanding of the components of movement in typical development 0-12 months
- Participants will achieve a basic understanding of the components of atypical movement
- Participants will achieve a basic understanding of the components of normal postural reactions necessary for motor function
- Participants will achieve a preliminary understanding of neurodevelopmental therapy concepts, principles of assessment and treatment
